



Short Term

- 1-3 years
- Focuses on near-term issues the elected government wants to address in the expected future

Medium-Term

- 3-5 years
- Identifies
 proposals to
 address issues
 in the expected
 future and
 proactively lays
 the framework
 to address
 emerging
 challenges and
 opportunities

Foresight

- 5 to 15 years
- Identifies
 emerging
 challenges and
 tests
 assumptions
 and strategies
 that are robust
 across a range
 of plausible
 futures

Foresight can provide a context to improve near and medium term thinking
